

FINANCIAL DESIGNATION FLYER

Apex Community Church relies on the financial support of our partners in ministry. If you would like to support the ministry of Apex please make your check payable to "Apex Community Church". We request that you attach a post-it-note or other form of separate notation that indicates where you would like your donation to go (i.e. preferable **not** the memo line of your check).

The following are the accepted areas of designated giving.

general fund *(NO NOTE REQUIRED)*

Financial gifts without a clearly documented designation go to the general fund. The general fund is what the Apex budget is based upon for a given fiscal year. The general fund pays for ministry expenses, mission expenses, operations, capital improvements, etc. The general fund is vital in keeping the entity of Apex Community Church moving forward.

capital *(NOTE "CAPITAL" WITH YOUR SUPPORT)*

The Lord has blessed Apex with a great location, facility, media equipment, and so forth. Much like your personal capital, e.g. your home or car, our stuff requires upkeep and maintenance as well. If you want to help keep the Gathering environments cool in the summer or prevent leaks from the roof on your pew consider designating money to the capital fund. In 2008 we have several large capital items that need replaced, such as main power lines (est. \$115K), air conditioning units (est. \$175k), and other such items.

region fund (1, 2, 3, 4, or 5) *(NOTE "REGION" AND NO. WITH YOUR SUPPORT)*

Your house church has access to financial resources, for mission trips, supporting a missionary, assisting someone in need, etc. Although Apex budgets money for each region, we allow people to give additional funds to the region to further support local and global activities.

missions general fund *(NOTE "MISSIONS" WITH YOUR SUPPORT)*

Some donors would like to contribute to missions, but do not have any specific missions in mind. Simply by noting 'Missions' in their check's memo line, their donation will go to support mission work through Apex.

apex missionaries *(NOTE MISSIONARY NAME WITH YOUR SUPPORT)*

Apex supports two categories of missionaries: (a) those that are missionaries from partnering organizations and (b) those that are missionaries sent directly from Apex. We allow and request that you assist us in supporting those in category (b), who are the following:

- (1) Todd & Erin Hammerstrom *(serving in Windhoek, Namibia, working with university students)*
- (2) Buddy & Julia Bahun *(serving in Okahandja, Namibia, working alongside Christ's Hope International and establishing The Grace and The Glory Community Church)*
- (3) Jim & Eeva Duddleston *(serving locally, equipping believers to understand and effectively engage with internationals in the Dayton area)*

mission trips *(NOTE TRIP NAME WITH YOUR SUPPORT)*

House churches are encouraged to be missional and therefore from time-to-time they request permission for financial assistance to go on a mission trip. As these trips come about you are able to designate your financial support to assist those serving on the team.

mission focused teams *(NOTE FOCUS TEAM NAME WITH YOUR SUPPORT)*

The mission's team defined several areas of focus for Apex missions; the focus groups are the following:

- (1) US Unreached Peoples *(focuses on reaching unreached people groups (like international students or refugees) who reside in the US)*
- (2) International Reached Peoples *(focuses on reaching reached people groups who reside outside of the U.S. (such as peoples in Mexico or Namibia). A reached people group is defined as one in which there is an indigenous church able to spread the gospel without outside help)*
- (3) International Unreached Peoples *(focuses on reaching unreached people groups who reside outside of the U.S. This includes most people groups in the "10/40 Window" who do not have an indigenous church that is able to spread the gospel without help)*
